CHALLENGES - Consolidated List

The original list of challenges was generated at the April 19 forum. That list was consolidated into this shorter list by combining items that were very similar, then grouping them into categories. At the May 17 forum, participants chose items they considered to be most important. The numbers in the right column indicate how many people chose each item. The items with stars and yellow highlighting are the ones that received the most "votes."

"Generational Issues" is highlighted as a group because there was a strong feeling that these issues are important but not enough consensus on specific items to advance them individually.
